
- Mentorship opportunities and tutoring for students who are identified as future STEAM majors and seeking careers in high-skilled, high-growth occupations.

Rosetta Stone program gains momentum at Varnett


Riding a wave of national attention, The Varnett Public School's Rosetta Stone language program will begin in earnest for the 2017-18 school year.

Rosetta Stone's first-year success earned recognition from Defender News Service, Education Dive news service, Globe Newswire, Broadway World and even The Street, a financial news service.

With a Spanish-speaking population of more than 40 percent, Varnett uses the Rosetta Stone technology to help students with English language learning. Up to 750 English as a Second Language (ESL) students have access to the digital program, helping them to develop English reading, writing and speaking skills at an accelerated pace. Varnett also makes Rosetta Stone accessible on computers, laptops, smart phones, I-Pads and Kindles.

"Since implementing Rosetta Stone in our schools in January, we've seen our ESL students make tremendous gains in their English language learning," said Dr. Margaret Stroud, superintendent of the Varnett district. "The program is particularly appealing because the technology allows students to learn on the go - whether they are at home or in class - and they can self-pace their instruction."

Some teachers and English speaking students are also applying Rosetta Stone to learn other languages, including Spanish.

Discipline policy ensures due process for students

The Varnett Public School has posted on its website an expanded Code of Student Conduct that emphasizes due process for students.

The 17-page document, which addresses unacceptable behavior and discipline, may be found under the Parents tab on Varnett's home page (varnett.org).

It calls for Varnett to provide for the fair and equitable treatment of students facing suspension and expulsion by affording them their due process rights under the law.

"For students facing suspension or expulsion from school because of their alleged violations of student code or conduct, they must be afforded an informal hearing with school administrators before such (discipline) is finalized," the document states.

We ask that parents and guardians fully read the document to help ensure that students, parents and the school can "share the responsibility for creating the best possible educational setting."
